The Moreton Bay Rail Link progress has moved into Mango Hill as major works begin on Dohles Rocks Road

The Moreton Bay Rail Link is making its first visible marks on Mango Hill.

Clearing works for the \$1.147 billion project are making their way into Mango Hill with work now visible from Anzac Ave.



An extra 10 healthy koalas have been captured and included in the tagging and monitoring program included as part of the project.

Satellite offices and worker facilities have also been installed at Mango Hill as clearing work continues along the rail link corridor.

Residents will also see several new site access points constructed soon, with sites at Kinsellas Rd and Halpine Dr in Mango Hill, with some traffic control and lanes closures needed during construction.

At Kallangur, work will begin to prepare for the construction of a bridge over Dohles Rocks Rd.

Work has almost completed at the intersection of School Rd and Dohles Rocks Rd, which will help with traffic flow during construction.

As part of the works, additional traffic monitoring cameras will be installed at locations throughout Kallangur.

There will also be ongoing intermittent lane closures in the vicinity of School Road and Clyde Streets and Duffield Road.
